To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Cary Johnson, of Hamilton County, Ohio,  
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at *San Jose*  
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Cary Johnson  
according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for  
the South East quarter of Section twenty two, in Township thirty seven North Range five West, of the second Division,  
in the District of Kansas subject to sale at *San Jose, Indiana*, containing one hundred and sixty acres  
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-  
chased by the said Cary Johnson

**NOW KNOW YE,** That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the  
several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Cary Johnson  
and to his heirs, the said tract above described:  
To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, therunto belonging, unto the said  
Cary Johnson and to his heirs and assigns forever.
