To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Edward Billings of Laporte County, Indiana has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Laporte whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Edward Billings according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the South West quarter, of section nine, in Township thirty four North, of Range six West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Laporte Indiana, containing one hundred and sixty Acres,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Edward Billings

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the promises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Edward Billings and to his heirs, the said tract above described:

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Edward Billings and to his heirs and assigns forever.

PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
