Whereas *Lazarus Silberman*, of Cooks County, Illinois

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States, a Certificate of the REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at Indianapolis, Indiana, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said *Lazarus Silberman*

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the *Lot or fractional South West quarter*, of the North East quarter, *South of the Indian boundary line*, of Section thirty five, in Township thirty seven North, of Range seven West, in the district of lands subject to sale at Indianapolis Indiana, containing twenty eight acres, and forty hundredths of an acre,

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said *Lazarus Silberman*

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said *Lazarus Silberman*

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said *Lazarus Silberman*

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
