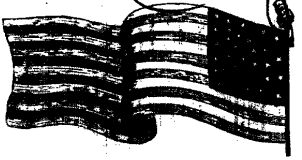

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, Warrant No. 92612 for 120 acres in favor of Peter Baker private Captain Manglis Company Pennsylvania Militia Mar 1812

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the lot numbered one of Section twenty, the west part of West half and the lot numbered four of section twenty in township thirty seven north, of Range six west, in the district of lands subject to sale at Indianapolis Indiana, containing one hundred and twenty three acres and thirty hundredths of an acre, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL the said warrant having been assigned by the said Peter Baker to David J. Hunter, in whose favor said tract has been located

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said David J. Hunter as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said David J. Hunter as assignee as aforesaid and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, James Buchanan PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.

GIVEN under my hand, at the CITY OF WASHINGTON, the fifteenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, and of the INDEPENDENCE OF THE UNITED STATES the eighty fifth
