To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 900 for 44 acres, issued in favor of Daniel Young Private in Captain Walker's Company Second Regiment Vermont Militia War of 1812

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located, upon the Southeast quarter of the ^{West} North East quarter of Section Three in Township Thirty four, of Range Seven West, in the District of Lands set apart to sale as Mynamae Indiana, containing 30 1/2 acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Daniel Young

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Daniel Young and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Millard Fillmore PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
