To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850,

entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 28625 for 80 acres, issued in favor of James White Private in Captain Nicholson's Company Sixty seventh Regiment Virginia Militia War 1812

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the East half of the South East quarter of Section Eleven in Township Thirty three of Range Five West in the District of Lands subject to sale at Winamac Indiana containing Eighty Acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: Which has been assigned to Clarenton Lee

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Clarenton Lee

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Clarenton Lee and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Millard Fillmore PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
