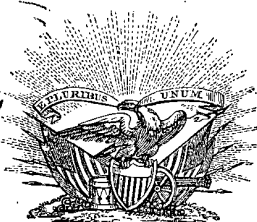

# The United States of America,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 5,968. for 40. acres,

issued in favor of *Philip Craver, private in Captain Coffin's Company, District of Columbia Militia War 1812.*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *South East quarter of the North East quarter of Section thirty five, in Township thirty five, of Range seven, West, in the District of land subject to sale at Vincennes, Indiana, containing forty acres,*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *which has been appropiated unto John Chambers.*

Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *John Chambers,*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *John Chambers, and to his,*

heirs and assigns forever.
