To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850,

entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 61601 for 40 acres, issued in favor of Anna Fairbanks, Widow of David Fairbanks, Private Captain Webbers Company First Regiment Connecticut Militia War of 1812

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the South East quarter of the South West quarter of section one, in Town ship thirty Three, of Range seven West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Wabamoc, Indiana, containing forty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: Which has been assigned unto Charles & DeWolf

Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Charles & DeWolf

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Charles & DeWolf and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Franklin Pierce PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
