Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 45,480 for 40 acres, issued in favor of Sally Bailey Widow of Bartholomew Bailey deceased, Private in Captain Andrews Company Connecticut Militia War 1812,

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the North East quarter of the North East quarter of section twelve in Township Thirty Three of Range seven West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Wenamaw Indiana, containing Forty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: Which has been assigned unto Charles E DeWolfe

Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Charles E DeWolfe

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Charles E DeWolfe and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
