Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said William Russell

the tract of Land above-described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said William Russell and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
