Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 23th, 1850,

entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 36752, for 40 acres,

issued in favor of *John Kearney Private in Captain McLeod's Company Ohio Volunteers*
War 1812

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the

South East quarter of the North west quarter of Section thirty one in Township thirty five of Range 4th West in the District of Lands Subject to Sale at Winamer Indians Containing forty Acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *which has been assigned to Joseph Leonard*

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Joseph Leonard*

the tract of Land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Joseph Leonard and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
