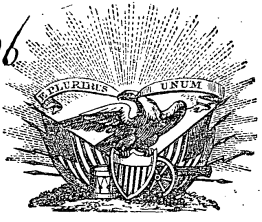

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850,

entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. *82617* for *40* acres, issued in favor of *Catharine Whitecomb, Widow of Joseph Whitecomb, Private in Captain Sennys Company Massachusetts Militia War 1812*
