To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Know Ye, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled: "An Act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847.

Isaac Zumwalt late a private in Captain Mc Culloch's Company, First Regiment, Texas Mounted Volunteers

having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in his favor, numbered *1.806*

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto *James Brooks assignee of said Isaac Zumwalt and to his heirs, the South West Quarter of the South East Quarter of Section Fourteen, in Township Thirty Two, of Range Five West in the District of lands subject to sale at Winamac, Indiana, containing Forty Acres.*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said *part of said* section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *James Brooks and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, *Millard Fillmore* PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
