Know Ye, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847.

Hiram Godnew, private in Captain Howe's Company Second Regiment United States Dragoons,

having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in his favor, numbered 51.711

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto Joshua Gander, Assignee of Leonard Godnew father and heir at law of said Hiram Godnew, deceased and to his heirs, the North West Quarter of section Twelve, in Township Thirty six, of Range Seven West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Winamac Indiana, containing One Hundred and sixty acres,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Quarter section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Joshua Gander, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
