Know Ye, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847.

having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in his favor, numbered 41,916

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto Armar M. Farland, assigned of said Davis Bates, and to his heirs, the North half of the North West quarter of Section Three, and the North half of the North East quarter, and the North half of the North West quarter of Section Four, in Township Thirty three, of Range Seven West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Winamac, Indiana, containing One hundred and Ninety-five Acres, and Eighty-seven hundredths of an Acre

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned War- rants; in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847, TO HAVE AND

TO HOLD the said parts of said section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Armar M. Farland, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
