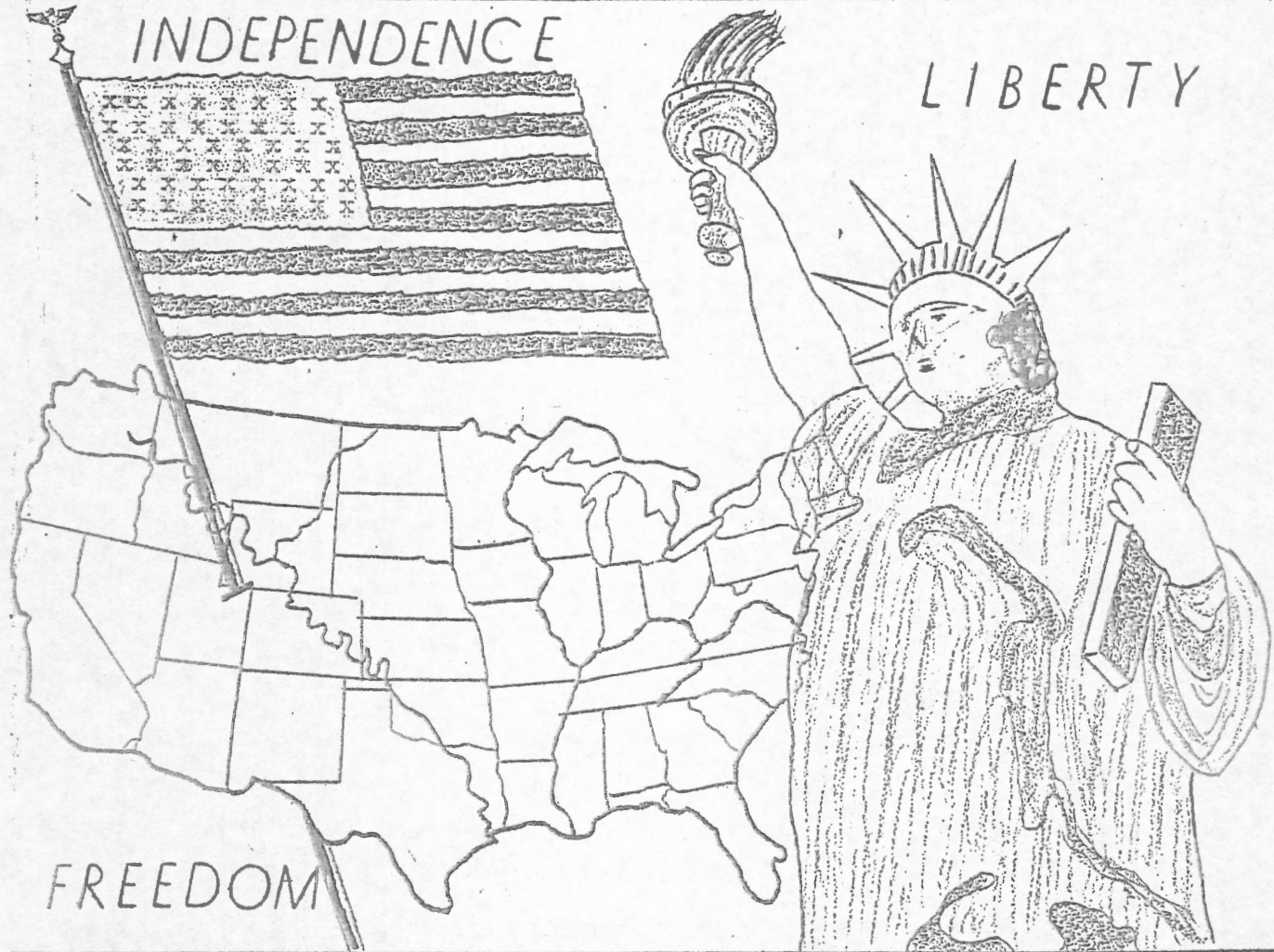

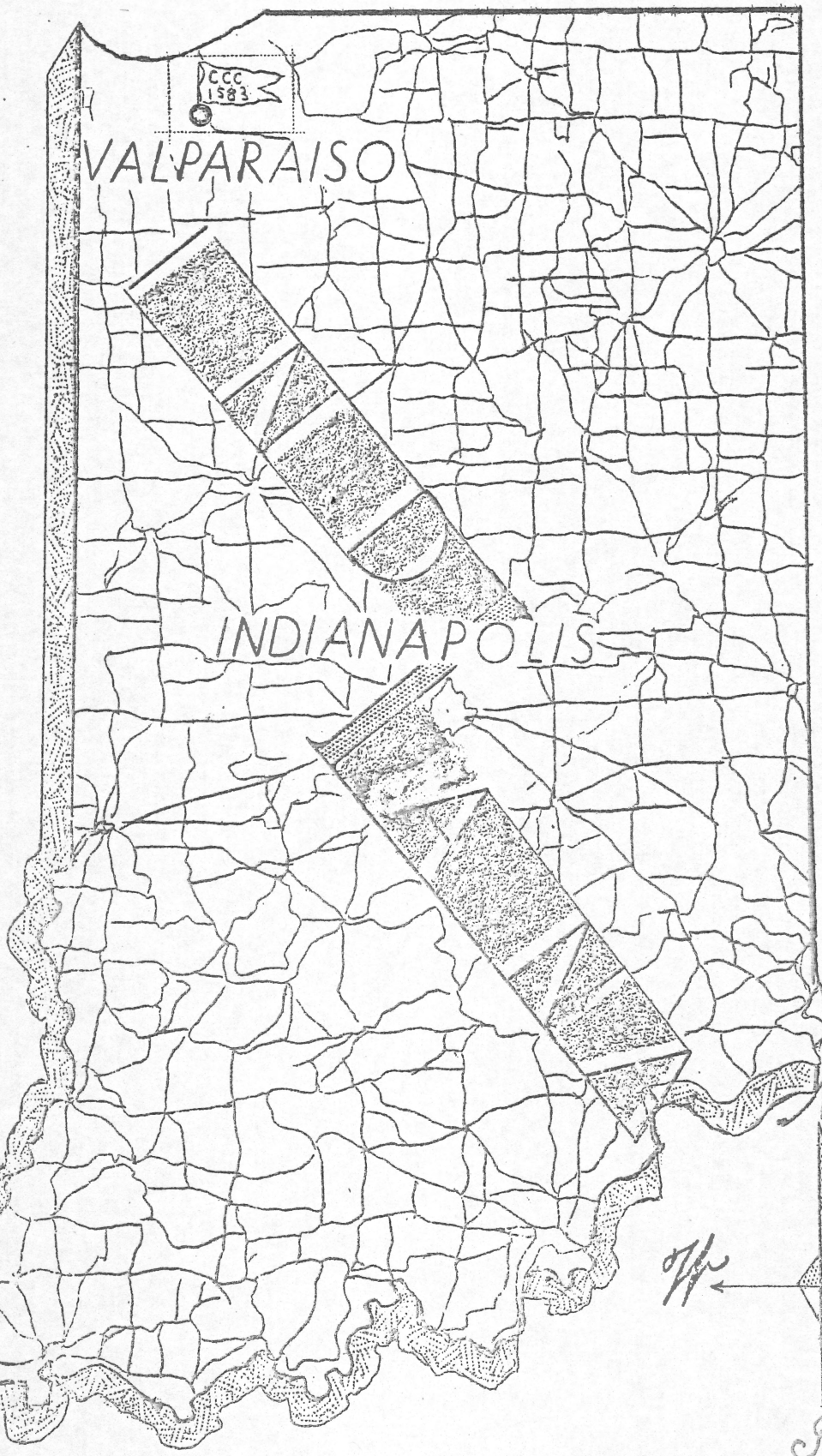
EDITORIAL NOTE

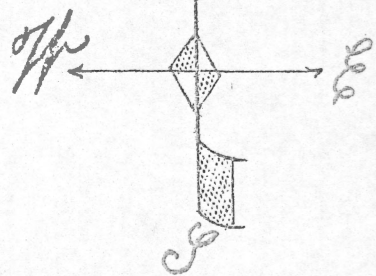

FIFTY NEW ENROLLEES OF CAMP CALUMET ENTER EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM FOR SUMMER.

Fifty new enrollees who have just recently enrolled in Camp Calumet are actively engaged in the new summer camp educational program, a copy of which is on the following page. Most of the new members are enrolled in such courses as First Aid, Job - finding, and others.

Half of the new group are from Terre Haute, Indiana,

while the other half are from the Calumet district. Over 50% of the whole enrollment are High School graduates.

NEW SHOP COMPLETED ..

The new shop, located now in what was formerly the drying house has reached completion. The carpentry and woodworking classes are now making new benches for the shop machinery, as well as cubbards for storing venier wood.

Among several special features of the shop is the tool room which is in the left hand corner next to the door. The switch box is inside the tool room as a safety precautionary measure. Light, ventilation, and arrangement of equipment are ideal.

NEW ENROLLEES STIMULATE READING INTERESTS OF OLDER MEN

According to statistics from the library, the circulation of books has increased 85% since the new enrollees entered camp on July 13th and 20th. A large percentage of the new men spent a lot of their leisure time in the library, thus stimulating the old men to find things of interest that they didn't realize was previously there.
