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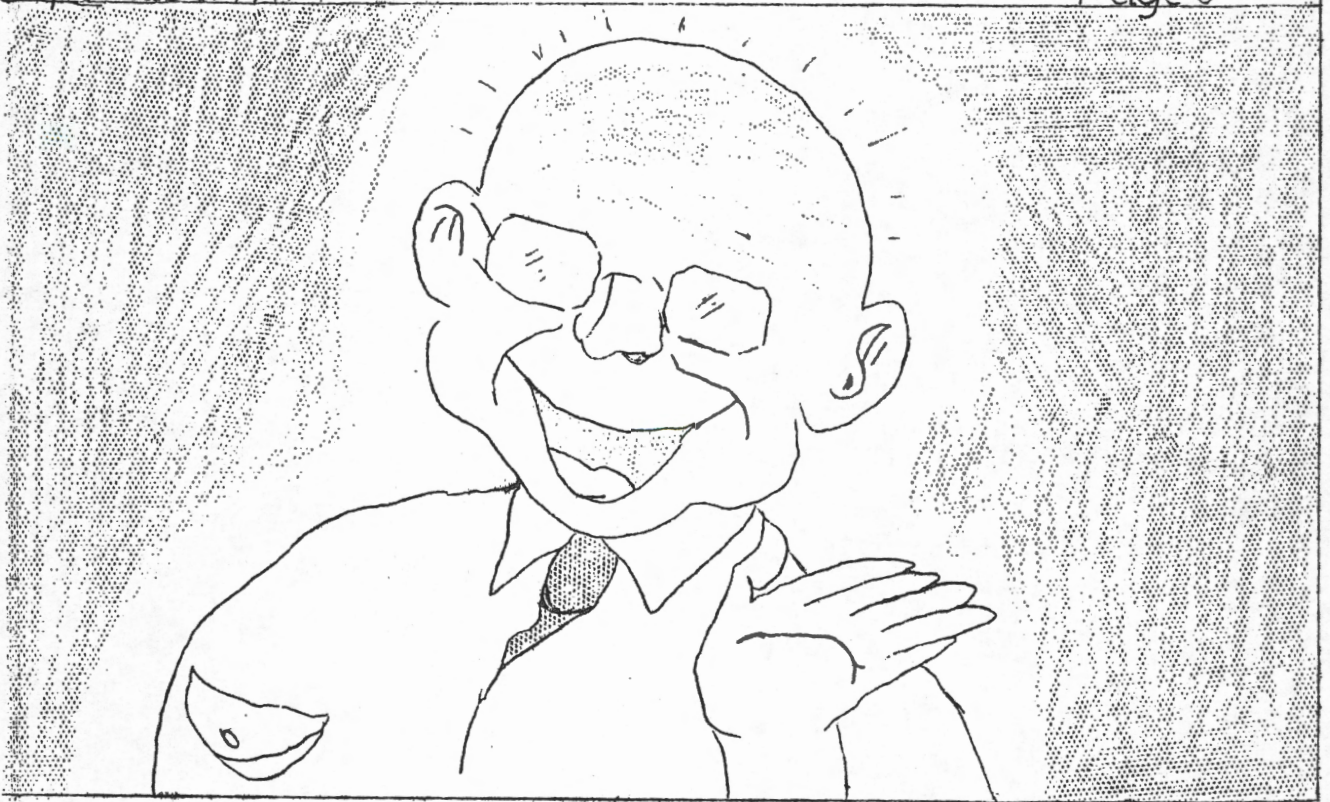
Pop Powers doesn't like the word, GRAVY for some reason or another. WHY? Is it because he doesn't like to make it?

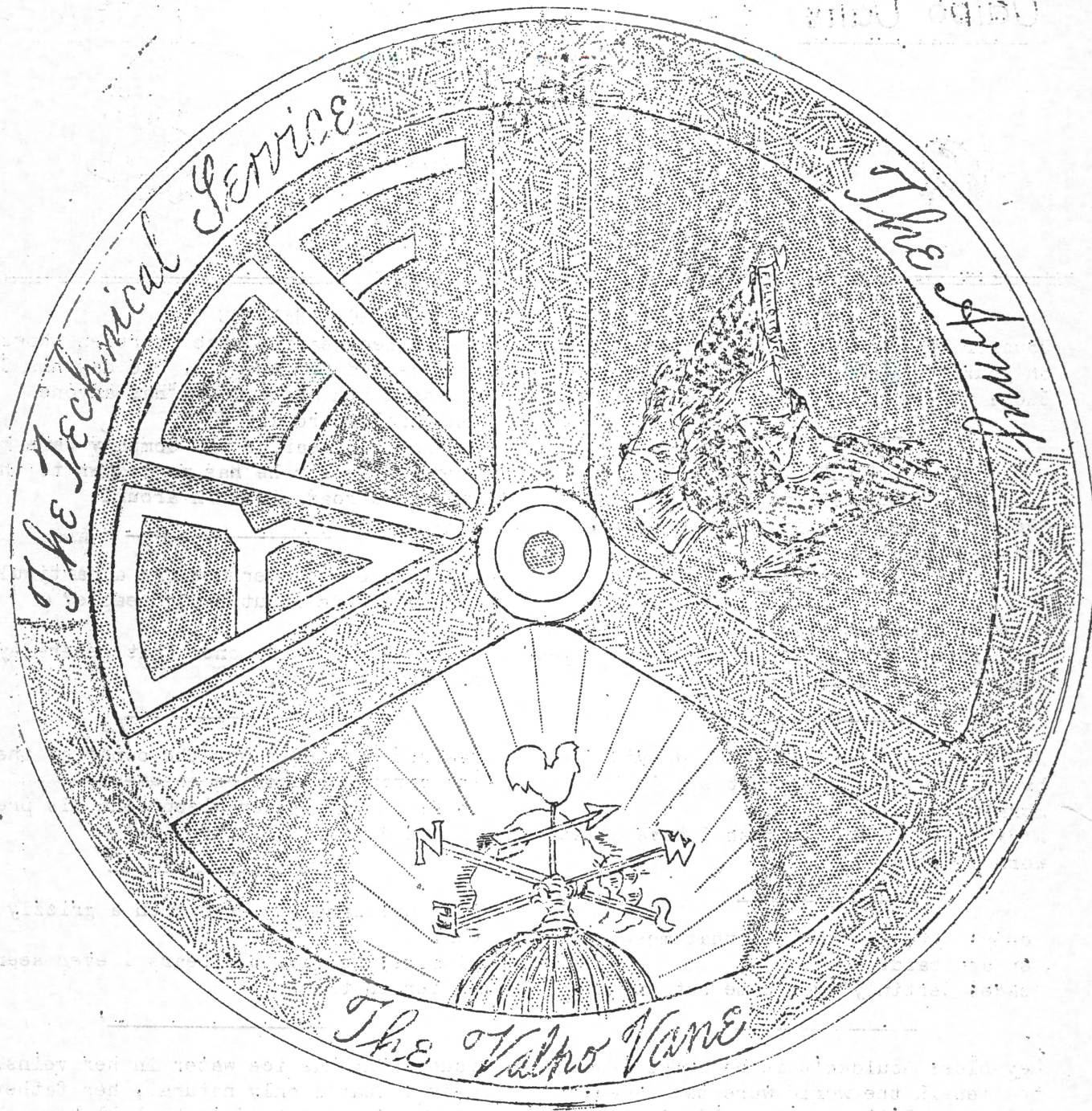
