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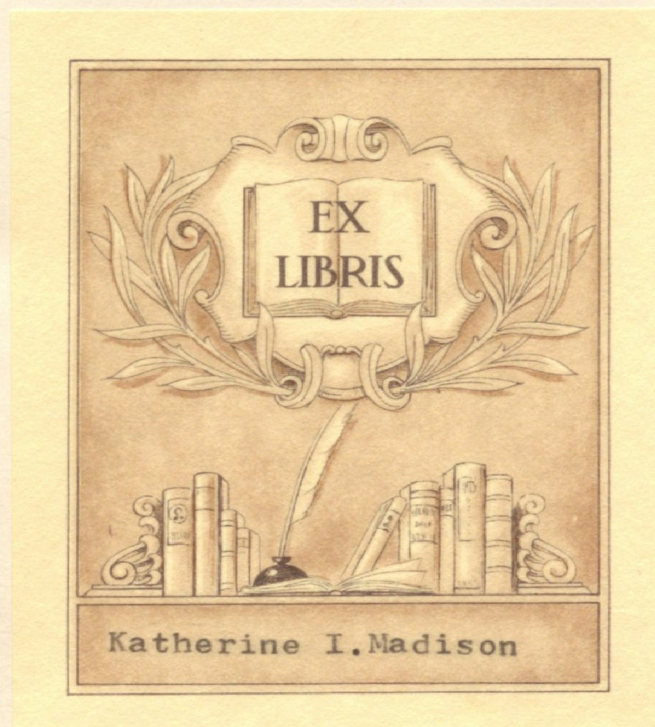

### THE ORGANIZATION

Horse Prairie, Sat. Sep. 7, 1844. 1 P.M.

Public notice having been previously given according to permission granted by the Lake Presbytery the following persons assembled at the house of Saml C. Beebe and presented to the Rev. G.C. Brown, the committee appointed by the Presbytery for this purpose. A letter of dismission from the Presbyterian Church of Valparaiso, to wit Mr. Ezra Reeve, Mr. John More. Mr. Charles Gregg & Mrs. Deborah Gregg, his wife, Mr. Samuel C. Beebe & Mrs. Currence Beebe, his wife, Mr. Augustine Humphrey & Mrs. Harriet A. Humphrey his wife, & Mr. Isaac Sweeny, and also Mrs. Mana Reeve a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church. They having declared their wish to be organized into a church of prayer, by Rev. I. C. Brown, constituted the Presbyterian Church of Salem, Porter County, Ind.

An election was then held for three Ruling Elders. The election resulted in the choice of Mr. Charles Gregg, Mr. Ezra Reeve & Mr. John Moore. Messrs Gregg & Reeve having signified their acceptance of the office to which they were elected, their ordination was appointed to take place on tomorrow (Sabbath) just before the administration of the Lord's Supper.

Sabbath, Sep. 8th Mr. Charles Gregg and Mr. Ezra Reeve were ordained to the office of Ruling Elder by the imposition of hands after which the church united in the celebration of the Lord's Supper.

Mr. Ezra Reeve was appointed Clerk of the Session and to attend the next Presbytery.

Mr. Moore for the present was not prepared to say that he would accept of the office to which he had been elected.

Previous notice having been given & a sermon preached in reference to the duties of ruling elder - Bro. Silas Gregg was chosen to the office of ruling elder; -- male & female members all participating in the election.

Octr. 3rd after serman he was duly set apart to the office of Ruling Elder in the Presbyterian Church of Salem, by prayer & the laying on of hands; -- after which he took his seat with Session.

Bro. Silas Gregg, committee, reported that he had called upon Mr. Brewer who assigned some little misunderstanding in reference to certain remarks made at a church meeting last winter & sickness in his family as reasons for his frequent absence from the stated means of grace. These difficulties were now removed & he should endeavor to attend more constantly.

- It was resolved that no farther action was called for.

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The same committee reported that Mrs. Soles gave as reason certain difficulties she had with the pastor and one of the elders. With the hope that these difficulties will soon be removed by an interview with the parties respectively it was resolved that no farther action be had at present.

Bros. Charles & Silas Gregg, the committee appointed to visit the family of Mr. Porter reported as follows;

Mrs. Porter had a great deal to say & complained that the Session had neglected to attend to these difficulties at an earlier day. She said she had nothing in particular against any one & she would endeavor to attend public service hereafter whenever practicable.

Miss Louisa Porter said she had nothing in particular against any one & not any charge against Mr. Townley as reasons for having absented herself from public worship. She added that she would endeavor to attend meetings for the future.

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Miss Jane Porter ~~said~~ refused to give any direct answer to the question in reference to her absenting herself from public service. Said the preaching did her no good but rather an injury. She would attend meeting when she couldn't help it.

Mr Porter was not seen by the committee; but subsequently handed in to the Session a paper, of which the following is a copy.

cc Having been called upon by Elder Reeve, one of the committee appointed to wait on us, for our reasons for neglecting to meet with the Ch. of Salem for worship, would respectfully state to the officers of said Church that it is well known that for months we have stood publicly charged before the Church, by Mrs. Humphry with the sin of lying, with regard to the letter that was sent to Mrs

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Perkins. And after offering testimony, that we think should be believed to prove our innocence. She still refuses to give us satisfaction, but justifies herself still, by inclining to disbelieve the witness; and while this state of things exists we cannot meet to worship with Mrs. Humphry, with that unity of feeling that shd. be felt by Christians, meeting to worship their God. We have therefore, from time to time, met with our Brethren of other branches of Christ's Church.

The committee appointed to visit Mrs. Reeve & her two children, reported that they had attended to the duty assigned them. Mrs. R. said she had no charges to bring against Mr. Townley but that it had not, ordinarily, been convenient to attend.--

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Mr. Augustine Humphry presented the following paper wh. was read, vis.

"The undersigned would respectfully ask the Session of the Church of Salem to consider the following:

I do hereby charge Mr. Philo A. Porter, a member of this church, with unchristian conduct in reference to certain matters between my wife, Harriet & Mrs. Lucy Perkins.

Specification I charge that sometime during the summer of 1847 (about the month of June, according to recollection, he, Mr. Porter, took up, made & circulated false reports, charging my wife, among other things, with the sin of lying; all calculated to injure her Christian character and standing; and this without ever coming to converse with her, as he was in duty bound. These report were such that her pastor

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deemed it necessary to apprise her of them, & to urge her to attend to it without delay.

Specification II I charge him with unchristian conduct in continuing to speak of these things to her injury after he was apprised that the remarks of my wife were probably well founded.

Specification III I charge him with unchristian conduct in denying that he had any knowledge what ever of a certain letter having been written to Mr Perkins, when the letter was written under his own roof, by one resident in his family, & taken with one or two other to the Post Office in Valparaiso; & when too he had said to the writer of it previously that she Mrs. Perkins, ought to be notified upon the subject.

Session then had recess until afternoon. After recess the following paper drawn up by the moderator & signed

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by the parties respectively & severally, including their families, was read and ~~understood-to-be~~ publicly assented to before a large congregation present vis.

Declaration of Mr. P.A. Porter and family and Mrs. H. Humphry

It is generally known that for sometime past an unpleasant misunderstanding has existed between the undersigned.

We hereby - declare that this day we have come to a full explanation, and that there may be no misapprehension in relation to this whole matter before this community & to relieve the minds of all from every wrong impression, we do, in good faith, make the following declaration, vis

I, P. A. Porter, do declare before the Searcher of hearts that I have not intended to call in question the

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veracity of Mrs. Humphry.

And we, P. A. Porter, Elisabeth Porter, J. E. Porter and Lavisia S. Porter do with equal solemnity declare that we had no knowledge whatever of the writing of a certain letter to Mrs. Lucy Perkins, and which has caused so much difficulty among us. Although written under our roof it was wholly without our knowledge & responsibility. And I, Harriet A. Humphry do, with the same solemn appeal, declare that I do receive these declarations of Mr. Porter and his family in good faith, as true; and that I am grieved that upon a former occasion when they declared their innocence I expressed my dissatisfaction with their disavowal of the authorship of said letter.

And we do all hereby declare our utter grief that we have given occasion of offence to the world, and have

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grived away the Holy Spirit. And since we do farther declare before Almighty God, that as Christians, for his honor, we will not in future give utterance to any uncharitable reflections nor will we listen to any one who would attempt to sow discord among brethern.

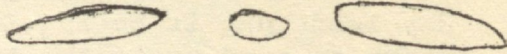

His son John ? Hollet sustained his examination on religious experience & doctrine well He being a bible reader & trained up in the ch. seemed to have no difficulties respecting the Bible or it 's doctrines. Has also taken part in the Converts prayer meeting.

Orlando R. Beebe a youth of about 16 was examined closely as were all the others, and as he had long been

a Sabbath School Scholar he answered the questions well He was questioned as to his desire to preach the Gospel he said he had. We hope that God has called him out of the world for this very purpose.

John F. Campbell another youth of about 18 & child of the ch. having given full satisfaction was also received.

Universalism had made some inroads in her mind & hence we had to help her. to get rid of those erroneous ideas. She was troubled some what about the doctrines of election & future punishment, but she expressed herself satisfied with our explanation, & willing to believe the Bible even tho she cannot comprehend all it's mysteries. She will have her children Baptized.

B. Mrs. Electa A. Hughes was examined & gave full evidence of her regeneration, and expressed her willingness and preference for our Church. Her early education
